• Complete and file a Domestic Relations Information Sheet (Form 4A-101).	✓
• Complete and file a Petition for Dissolution of Marriage (without children)(Form 4A-102)(signed by Petitioner only).	✓
• Complete and file a Marital Settlement Agreement (signed and notarized by both parties)(Form 4A-301).	✓
• Complete and submit a Final Decree of Dissolution of Marriage (signed by both parties)(Form 4A-305).	✓
• Pay filing fee of \$137 (Exact cash, cashier's check, or money order) (see below if you cannot afford the filing fee).	✓
<b>I want to file for a divorce and my spouse and I do not agree on all matters. What do I do?</b>	
• Complete and file a Domestic Relations Information Sheet (Form 4A-101).	✓
• Complete and file a Petition for Dissolution of Marriage (without children)(Form 4A-102).	✓
• Complete and submit a Summons, and complete and submit an Entry of Appearance (Form 4A-105).	
• The Clerk's office will issue the Summons and a Temporary Domestic Order. Have the opposing party served with a copy of the Summons, Petition for Dissolution of Marriage, and Temporary Domestic Order (see Service of Process).	✓
• Pay filing fee of \$137 (Exact cash, cashier's check, or money order) (see below if you cannot afford the filing fee).	✓
<b>I can't afford to pay the filing fee. What do I do?</b>	
• Complete an Application for Free Process and submit along with a proposed Order to the court.	✓
• If you receive public benefits, attach proof of your benefits to the Free Process application	✓
<b>The opposing party did not file a Response and it has been more than 30 days. What do I do?</b>	
• Complete and file an Affidavit as to Respondent's Failure to Plead or Otherwise Defend (Form 4A-311).	✓
• Complete a Certificate as to the State of the Record (Form 4A-312) (for the Clerk to issue) and submit a self-addressed stamped envelope to the Clerk's office.	✓
• After you receive the completed Certificate as to the State of the Record from the Clerk's office, complete and file with the Clerk's office. an Application for Default Judgment and Final Decree of Dissolution of Marriage (Form 4A-313) and a Default Judgment and Final Decree of Dissolution of Marriage (Form 4A-314),	✓
<b>I received the Return of Service. What do I do with it?</b>	
• File the Return of Service with the Clerk's office	✓
<b>We have property that is either separate and/or joint. What do we do?</b>	
• Both you and your spouse must exchange within 45 days an Interim Monthly Income and Expense Statement (Form 4A-212).	✓
• Both you and your spouse must exchange within 45 days a Community Property and Liabilities Schedule (Form 4A-214).	✓
• Both you and your spouse must exchange within 45 days a Separate Property and Debts Schedule (Form 4A-215).	✓
• Complete and file with the Clerk's office a Notice of Compliance (Form 4A-208).	✓
