• Complete a Response to Petition for Dissolution of Marriage (Form 4A-104).	✓
• File with District Court Clerk's office within 30 days of the date you were served.	✓
• Provide the spouse, or the spouse's attorney with a copy of your Response.	✓
We have property that is either separate and/or joint. What do we do?	
• Both you and your spouse must exchange within 45 days an Interim Monthly Income and Expense Statement (Form 4A-212).	✓
• Both you and your spouse must exchange within 45 days a Community Property and Liabilities Schedule (Form 4A-214).	✓
• Both you and your spouse must exchange within 45 days a Separate Property and Debts Schedule (Form 4A-215).	✓
• Complete and file with the Clerk's office a Notice of Compliance (Form 4A-208).	✓

FAQs

What happens if I do not file a response?
• If you do not file a response within 30 days from the date you are served, the opposing party can ask the court for a judgment against you without you knowing anything has happened. • See Service of Process & Defaults guide.
I want to talk to the judge and have the judge address some issues. What do I do?
• Complete and file a Motion and a Request for Hearing. See Motions, Hearings & Enforcement of Orders.
