We can assist eligible veterans with security deposit, rent, moving and storage costs, utilities, and related costs. We provide case management, community referrals and assistance with VA and other public benefits. Our ongoing collaboration with organizations such as yours helps us to continue to identify veterans eligible for SSVF assistance.

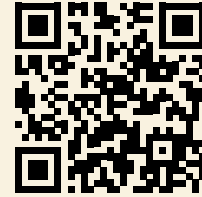

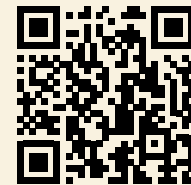
